

## **Chevron Irma Relief**

Chevron U.S.A. Inc. has announced a contribution of \$1 million from Chevron and the Chevron Global Community fund to assist with efforts to recover from the damage done by Hurricane Irma. In addition, the company will match any donations made to the relief efforts by its employees and retirees.

The \$1 million commitment includes a \$600,000 donation to the American Red Cross to support immediate relief efforts through the impacted region. Another \$400,000 is going to [DonorsChoose.org](http://DonorsChoose.org) for local public school classroom projects in south Florida.

These commitments follow Chevron's \$1 million donation to the American Red Cross for response to Hurricane Harvey, along with another \$1 million for [DonorsChoose.org](http://DonorsChoose.org). Chevron continues to stay abreast of recovery efforts and needs assessments moving forward.

Contributions made by U.S. payroll employees and retirees to the American National Red Cross and United Way of Greater Houston Hurricane Harvey relief efforts will be matched 2 to 1 from August 25 through October 31, 2017. Employees and retirees who have already reached their annual match cap under the Chevron Humankind program and wish to match a donation to either of these organizations can have up to \$500 matched by emailing Chevron Humankind. Match requests must be submitted by the October 31, 2017 deadline.

In addition, the company will match on a 1 to 1 basis, any donations made to the Hurricane Irma relief efforts by its employees and retirees. At this time there is no word on any possible 2 to 1 matches or over match cap exemption for Hurricane Irma contributions.

We would appreciate Chapter Presidents making this information immediately available to all their chapter members so that our retirees are made aware of this opportunity by Chevron to match their contributions to help in the Hurricane Harvey and Irma recovery by contributing to the relief efforts.
