An update on prescription drug coverage, open enrollment, ambulance coverage

President's Letter

Retirees cautioned about signing up for Medicare Prescription Drug Plan

I assumed the role of Chevron Retirees Association president on July 1. I not only want to thank the officers and members of the Association for their confidence but I want you to know I will make every effort to live up to the important task you have given me. I am fortunate to follow in the footsteps of Bob Olmstead, who held this position the last two years. I also am privileged to have a dedicated group of officers and committee chairs, who will be assisting me in achieving the CRA objectives.

In late October, we all will once again experience the Open Enrollment period for our various Chevron Healthcare programs. This year your options are somewhat more complicated because of the new Medicare Prescription Drug Program that goes into effect January 1, 2006. Concerning that program: LET ME WARN YOU NOT TO SIGN UP FOR THE MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG PLAN OR ANY OTHER PRESCRIPTION PLAN.

Here's why. If anyone signs up for any other plan beyond the ones being offered by Chevron, their Chevron Healthcare Coverage will be INVALIDATED. The consequences of such a mistake are so severe that I want to make certain no retiree or surviving spouse falls into this trap. (See more details in Kenneth Smith's Benefits Column on Page 1.)

On another subject, one of the four cornerstones of accomplishing the Association's Mission to attract and retain members is communications. "Encore" is one of our major communication tools to inform the members of what the Association is doing, as an advocate for its important issues. Though he's no spring chicken, Al Burnham of Red Bluff, Calif., certainly acts like one in his year-round volunteer activities in Lassen and Plumas National Forests, which span a combined 2.5-million acres in Northern California. As the U.S. Forest Service coordinator for five snowmobile clubs in that geographic region, he often drives 200 to 300 miles a day. His primary task is maintaining snowmobiling trails throughout the forests, including those in six snoparks. To do so, he must clear trails in the summer and fall, and install and hang trail signs on trees.

Burnham said, "About 90 percent of those Lassen National Forest trails, also open to cross-country skiers, are in scenic, hilly, mountain country surrounding Lassen Volcanic National Park (10,457 feet at Lassen Peak). I also serve all of California-Nevada as the Forest Service's Snowmobile Safety Training Coordinator. That includes holding two seminars each year on safety, survival and other issues."

He works, too, with a gun club, teaching gun safety to primarily teenagers new to hunting. Burnham, a member of the Norcal and East Bay chapters, concluded his 36-year Chevron service in 1986 as refinery shift coordinator at the Richmond Refinery.

Donated any blood recently? Darwin Eaton appeared on four Tulsa TV stations in April as he was heralded for becoming the only person in the Red Cross' Southwest Region to make 300 blood donations (37.5 gallons) in a lifetime. He began giving whole blood as a Warren Petroleum employee in 1949. He worked 42 years for the Gulf Companies, retiring in 1983 as Credit manager, Warren Petroleum, in Tulsa.

"I'm up to 302 donations now and I'm on a routine in which I give 'O' blood every 56 days. By the way, I was totally surprised by all that TV fuss with cameras, microphones and reporters. You can call it my 'less than 15 minutes of fame,'" said the good-natured Eaton.

Pirtle H. Guy not only drives his Ford Taurus around his hometown of Marshall, Texas, but he occasionally makes the 300-mile roundtrip alone to visit his sister in the Dallas suburb of Richardson. By the way, Guy is 101 years young. Earlier this year, among his volunteer activities was working in the rehab and ICU areas of Marshall's hospital.

Guy, an honorary member of the North Texas Chapter, retired from Gulf Oil in 1961 as resident manager, Dallas, concluding a 33-year career. He promptly served 12 years in the Dallas County Constable Office and two more as a deputy sheriff assigned as a court bailiff. He regales listeners as to how he was in the funeral procession for noted gangster "Pretty Boy" Floyd and attended the services for bank robbers Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow.

Encore Benefits Corner: Open enrollment is Oct. 17-28

This very important letter provides information about Medicare Part D, Medicare's new prescription drug benefit, which it is critical you understand. Please refer to the Chevron Human Resources letter for additional information or call the HR Service Center if you have any questions. Chevron Human Resources advises that the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) continues to provide additional information and clarifications about the administration of Medicare Part D, and Chevron will provide more details relevant to retirees as they become available.

With regard to Open Enrollment for 2006: Chevron has advised that Open Enrollment for 2006 is scheduled for Oct. 17-28. The Open Enrollment Newsletter is scheduled to be mailed the last day of September. The corporation recognizes that retirees impacted by Hurricane Katrina may not be able to receive mail. The issues surrounding Open Enrollment and its communications for these individuals are being worked out.

In previous columns, I asked that if you have questions to send them to me. Those with implications for our retiree community would be answered in this column. I recently had an issue regarding the use of an Out-of-Network ambulance service which responded to a 911 call. The retiree was billed an amount deemed in excess of the reasonable and customary sum.

United HealthCare has advised that, under the Chevron Medical Plan, two coinsurance levels exist. In-Network providers are covered at 90% of the contract amount and Out-of-Network providers at 80% of the allowable charge. In the case of an emergency service, the plan allows for the higher benefit level of 90% of the allowable charge regardless of the contract status of the provider.

You need to know, however, that few ambulance companies will contract with an insurance firm for emergency trips because the nature of their services guarantees them customers regardless of their contract status. Using 911 does not guarantee that an In-Network provider will respond to your emergency. In the subject case, United HealthCare covered 90% of the allowable charge - still leaving more than \$500 for the retiree to pay.

In emergencies, the comfort afforded by the immediate response of 911 will, in most cases, outweigh the added cost incurred if an out-of-network ambulance service responds to your 911 call.

She joined the chapter, which includes 105-paid Chevron and Texaco retirees in Oregon and Washington, in 1992. That's the same year she retired from Chevron USA as a telemarketer in the Willbridge, Ore., terminal, working with dealers who sold tires, batteries and accessories. Her Company years totaled 25.

Rose Marie Ritter of Verona, Pa., is president of the club with the longest name: Gulf Research Center Annuitants Association Chapter. It's comprised of some 500-paid members who were employed at the Gulf Research lab in Hamarville, 17 miles from Pittsburgh. Ritter also is busy as host committee chair for the CRA's 2006 Pittsburgh annual meeting. Added volunteer time is spent assisting chapter members, such as driving them to their doctor. Harvey's late husband, James, spent almost all 38 of his Chevron years in the Rocky Mountain states before retiring as an Area Production foreman. Labeth is president of the Southwest Mississippi Chapter, comprised of 40 Chevron, Gulf and Texaco retirees. Meetings are held six times a year in Brookhaven, about three hours north of the Gulf of Mexico. She formerly worked 31 years as a secretary in the central office of the Brookhaven School District, is a past president of the Mississippi Association of Educational Office Professionals and has chaired one of its committees each year. As a volunteer clerk for Lincoln County Baptist Association, she keeps the yearly records for 39 Baptist churches.

Maffei, Matzke receive awards

Kitty Maffei has been honored by Fresh Start Walnut Creek, a community service organization providing food, laundering and phone usage to San Francisco Bay Area homeless. She's the first to receive "The Kitty Maffei Kind-Hearted Person Award."

"We named the award in her honor because she makes life better for people, one person at a time," said Executive Director Susan Prather. "In our first three years of operation, Kitty has done such things as single-handedly supply lunch for everyone at Fresh Start two days a week, do laundry for people, keep us supplied with water and soft drinks, get involved in fund-raising and hug everyone she meets."

Some of Maffei's other volunteer efforts: tutoring at-risk high school students, serving as an officer for Future Business Leaders of America and chairing Safety Week for the Walnut Creek Transportation Commission. She received the 2002 ChevronTexaco Public Service Award for such work. As a CRA member, Maffei has been San Francisco Chapter president and a Contra Costa Chapter board member. In 1986, she retired as manager, Advanced Office Systems, Chevron CITC, to complete a 39-year Company career.

Richard Matzke, who lives near Walnut Creek in Alamo, has been selected to receive a College of Liberal Arts and Sciences Alumni Award from Iowa State University's Department of Geological and Atmospheric Sciences. Carl Jacobson, the awards chair wrote Matzke, "This award is given to distinguished alumni who have demonstrated outstanding achievement and received national or international recognition. Your extraordinary achievements in the oil industry make you a most deserving recipient."

Matzke retired as Chevron's vice chairman, completing a Company career of more than 40 years. The ChevronTexaco board of directors praised Matzke in 2001 "as a relentless portfolio builder. In addition to Venezuela, he played leading roles getting Chevron into Kuwait, Argentina, Brazil, Georgia, Azerbaijan, Thailand, Bangladesh, Qatar, Norway, the Mackenzie Delta, the Chad/Cameroon project and gas-to-liquids venture with Sasol."
