Autumn is in the air, and Open Enrollment has arrived again! You know it already because you have probably been bombarded with ads and phone calls just like I have. Remember that you need to work with the Chevron HR Service Center if you're pre-65, and you need to sign up through Via Benefits if you're 65 or over to receive the HRA reimbursement for medical/dental premiums!

Open Enrollment –This year's critical dates are:

⇒ **Pre-65 Eligible Participants – October 15th through October 26th (note – it's a very short window, as usual)**

Your 24-page booklet should have arrived already (call the HRSC if it hasn't). Your personalized Open Enrollment packages with group health choices and costs of coverage were mailed October 8-10, so they should have arrived already, or will soon.

⇒ **Post-65 Eligible Participants – October 15th through December 7th**

The fall newsletter was sent by Via Benefits in September (call them if you haven't received it). You will receive additional mailings from Chevron in October.

John Dewes, our Interim Chair of the Benefits Committee, has prepared a **detailed 4th Quarter Benefits Corner**, focusing on Open Enrollment for both pre- and post-65 retirees. It is included below in this edition of *Encore* and also posted on the CRA website. It has already been distributed directly to the Chapter Presidents.

Take a careful look at the Benefits Corner for full information, and please read all of your mailings from Via Benefits and from Chevron very carefully. Read all the fine print, make sure you understand and act on any exceptions, and take into consideration all the changes that may have occurred for you since last year, or that you anticipate may occur. There are a few wrinkles this year that some of you will need to take action on, such as changes to how supplemental life insurance premiums will be paid.

The **post-65 HRA reimbursement will remain the same for 2019**. And the continuing good news is that if you are satisfied with your current choices, you can let them roll over without taking any action, so long as the plans are continuing in your area! For post-65, Via Benefits does recommend you make a telephone appointment or go on-line to review the choices you have, just to see what is available. If you have questions, or want to shop around, or need to make a change, the licensed benefits advisors at Via Benefits are there to help and advise you.

If you are not able to get answers or appropriate action from either the HRSC or Via Benefits, please contact John Dewes and he will do what he can to help. His email and phone contact information are at the end of the Benefits Corner.

CRA News Briefs

International Tribunal Rules for Chevron in Ecuador Case

Sep 7, 2018 – An international tribunal administered by the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague has issued an award in favor of Chevron (NYSE: CVX) and its indirect subsidiary, Texaco Petroleum Company (TexPet), finding that the Republic of Ecuador violated its obligations under international treaties, investment agreements and international law. The tribunal unanimously held that a \$9.5 billion judgment rendered against Chevron in Lago Agrio, Ecuador, in 2011 was procured through fraud, bribery and corruption and was based on claims that had been already settled and released by the Republic of Ecuador years earlier. The tribunal concluded that the fraudulent Ecuadorian judgment “violates international public policy” and “should not be recognized or enforced by the courts of other States.” As a matter of international law, this award confirms Chevron is not obliged to comply with the Ecuadorian judgment.

Chevron’s 2018 Fuel Your School Program Helps Support Teachers

October 1, 2018 – Chevron U.S.A. Inc. (NYSE: CVX) today announced the launch of its 2018 Fuel Your School program, making up to \$6 million available to help support public school teachers and students in 17 U.S. communities, with the help of local Chevron and Texaco marketers and retailers in seven of those communities. Now in its ninth year, Chevron’s Fuel Your School program is a collaboration with DonorsChoose.org to help fund eligible classroom projects, including science, technology, engineering and math (STEM)-focused projects that can bring innovative and real-life learning opportunities to students.

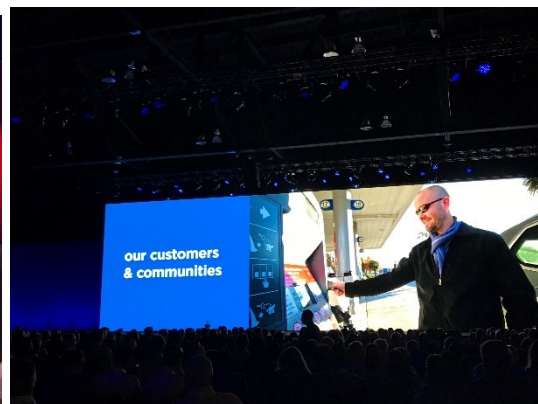
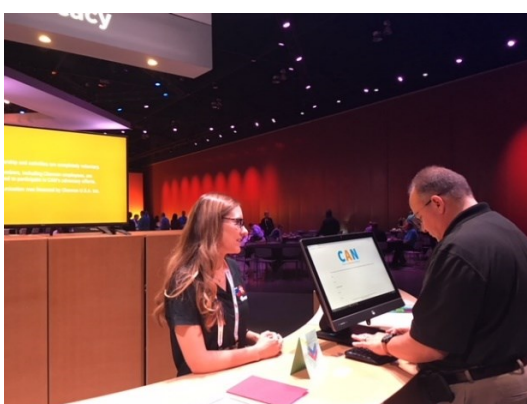

Al Mann – Combines Petroleum History into a Book

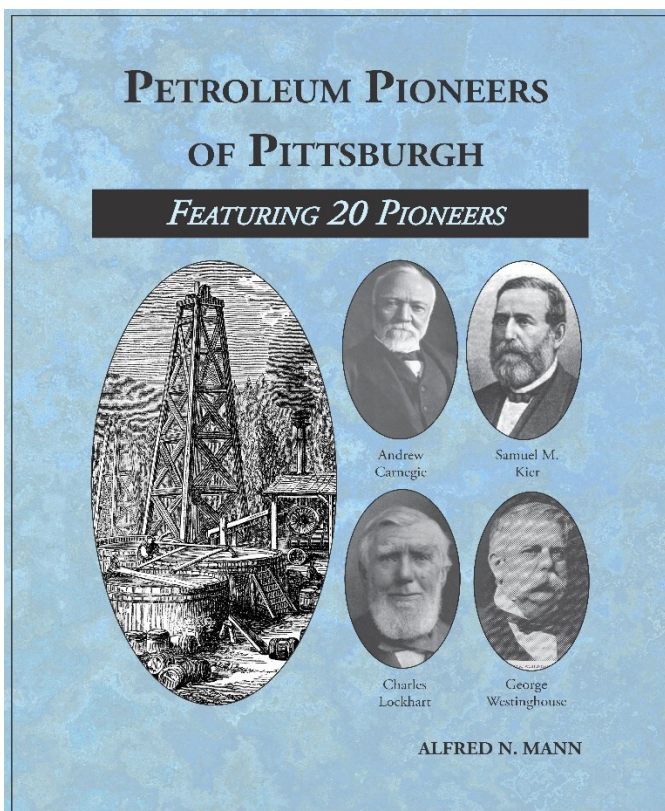
Alfred Mann was born in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1929 and attended high school there. He graduated from Cornell University in 1951 with a Bachelor's degree in Chemical Engineering. His first job was as a technologist at a chemical plant operated by Shell Chemical Company, near Long Beach, California, where he worked until 1957, interrupted by two years in the U.S. Army Chemical Corps. In 1957, he moved to Pittsburgh to work for Gulf Research at Harmarville. While with GR&DC he attended the University of Pittsburgh at night, receiving a Master's degree in Chemical Engineering in 1961.



At Gulf, he worked in the labs for a few years and then transferred to the Process Economics Group. He states "I worked under Joel Hirsch, a colorful character, who was Director of Process Economics for many years." Al was in charge of Chemical Economics, then the entire Economics Group, until 1983, when the Lab began to close down, with many taking early retirement. After a few years of consulting in the field of energy management, he joined the U.S. Department of Energy as a contract engineer at their Laboratory at Bruceton (near South Park), where he worked from 1991 to 2006.

Al met and married his wife at Long Beach, California in 1951. They just celebrated their 67th anniversary. They have two grown daughters and four grandsons. They lived in the Highland Park neighborhood of Pittsburgh for 52 years, finally downsizing and moving to Longwood, a Senior Community in Oakmont. For many years, Al has been interested in the history of chemical and refinery technology. This has culminated in him writing a recent book entitled ***Petroleum Pioneers of Pittsburgh***. By the time you read this, the book should have been published. It covers 22

pioneers in 20 chapters, and runs over 300 pages. Naturally, a major chapter covers the history of Gulf, including GR&DC. Al states, "I have been fortunate to know personally a number of the descendants of these pioneers, which has made writing the book an enjoyable and interesting project."



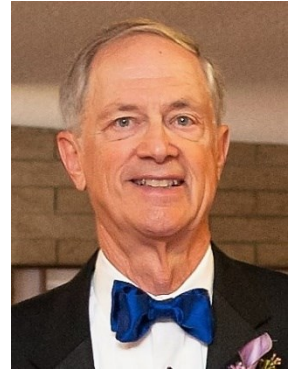
Benefits Corner *By John Dewes, Interim Chair, CRA Benefits Committee*

It is **Open Enrollment** time for 2019!

Pre-65 – October 15 – 26, 2018:

Newsletter is under "2019 benefit changes."

NOTE: Personalized pre-65 open enrollment packages with group health choices and cost of coverage in 2019 were mailed October 8 – 10. Please look for these and act promptly. If they do not arrive soon, call the HRSC – they will have your personal information.

Post-65 (Medicare) – October 15 – December 7, 2018

www.my.viabenefits.com/chevron (Via Benefits)

You should have received the newsletters describing open enrollment in a timely manner this year. If not, you can read them on-line by using the links above. Please note that there are some important items for post-65 retirees in the pre-65 newsletter. These will be communicated directly to post-65 retirees by mail later in October, along with a post-65 open enrollment readiness letter.

There will be **no change in the amount of the HRA reimbursement in 2019.**

Several instances have been reported by our retirees where HRA reimbursement stopped during the year. You have to have medical/dental premiums from medical plans offered through Via Benefits, or Medicare Part B in order to be reimbursed. The surest way to claim reimbursement is to use the November Social Security letter that states your Medicare Part B premiums for the coming year. (This is greater than the maximum reimbursement.) Instructions for filling out your personalized claim form(s) are on the Via Benefits website under Claims and Reimbursement.

Again this year, **if you are satisfied with your coverage**, and haven't had significant changes in your prescriptions or health status, **you can let your current choices roll over without taking any action**, unless your provider is no longer available. Via Benefits does recommend you make a telephone appointment or go on line to review the choices you have, just to see what is available.

If you receive an annuity and are **currently deducting supplemental insurance premiums from your monthly annuity check, there is one area where you must take action**. In the future, you will be billed and will need to make monthly payments. In December 2018, the charge will be deducted from your annuity check, **and** you will need to make a separate payment for your January 2019

premium. You can set up a direct charge against your bank account, which is strongly recommended. Those affected should already have received a letter explaining the new procedures. Please contact the HRSC if you haven't been notified.

For Pre-65, there will be a new sign-in procedure for the online Benefits Connection that will be secure, but eliminate the need for a PIN. This is covered in the newsletter you should already have received.

Reminder: please update your Via Benefits profile when you receive your new Medicare card with your new Medicare number. Via Benefits is able to use your Social Security number for 2019 as not everyone will have received his/her new Medicare cards yet. Medicare gives the following advice for protecting your identity:

- Don't share your Medicare Number or other personal information with anyone who contacts you by phone, email, or by approaching you in person, unless you've given them permission in advance.
- Medicare, or someone representing Medicare, will only call and ask for personal information in these situations:
 1. A Medicare health or drug plan can call you if you're already a member of the plan. The agent who helped you join can also call you.
 2. A customer service representative from 1-800-MEDICARE can call you if you've called and left a message or a representative said that someone would call you back.
- Only give personal information like your Medicare Number to doctors, insurers acting on your behalf, or trusted people in the community who work with Medicare like your State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP). (HICAP in California).
- If someone calls you and asks for your Medicare Number or other personal information, hang up and call us at 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227).

In any case, when you are not able to get answers or appropriate action from either the HRSC or Via Benefits, please contact me and I'll do what I can to help.
