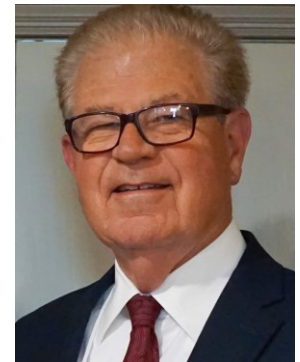

# President's Letter

## CRA Business Continues

In spite of the pandemic lockdown, your national CRA officers and committee chairs have continued their work. We have also been communicating with the area vice presidents and chapter presidents. Here’s a brief summary of some of our activity.

The previously mentioned volunteer committee assisted in setting up the 2020 President’s Business Planning Meeting (PBPM) – by Zoom. This meeting is normally held after the conclusion of the general sessions at each CRA Annual Meeting (AM). Since this year’s AM was cancelled, we decided we needed the PBPM to discuss current and upcoming CRA issues. This meeting is attended by CRA Officers, Committee Chairs, Area Vice Presidents, and Past CRA Presidents.

There were four major issues addressed at the PBPM:

2021 Mid-Year Meeting: This is normally scheduled for January of each year. Prospects for a “live” meeting were discussed and it was decided to keep our hotel reservations and make a final decision in December. Whether there is a live meeting or not, there will be a Zoom attendance option.

2021 Annual Meeting: Next year’s meeting is being hosted by the Southern California Area. It was originally planned as a combination hotel and cruise meeting, from Los Angeles to Vancouver. The cruise portion was cancelled due to the pandemic. The hotel venue was

moved from San Pedro to Los Angeles Airport (LAX). This should result in some cost savings and simplified travel for attendees. There will be a Zoom attendance option.

CRA Finances: Due to the cancellation of the 2020 AM, there are considerable CRA cost reductions for this year. However, some AM-related Chevron contributions for the 2020 AM were not received. A few CRA chapters did not collect or forward their 2020 dues to the CRA. There will be some new CRA costs for the previously mentioned communications initiatives. Over all, CRA finances are in excellent shape.

CRA Membership: CRA's leaders are concerned about the negative effects of the pandemic on chapter membership. Accordingly, the new communications initiatives were discussed and approved.

I hope we can all again participate in our local chapter meetings and functions. Please participate and maintain your friendships with your fellow retirees. Although the future won't be exactly the same as the past, it'll be close. The CRA will continue on and you should be part of that.

### **Elaine Yamaguchi: Lighting the Spark**

As the first member of her family to attend college, Elaine Yamaguchi quickly learned how to conquer her self-doubts and identify her love of education as a lifelong journey. That journey, which took her from Brandeis University to a PhD at Yale University, extended through a distinguished career as an organic chemist for Chevron.

But Elaine wasn't done there. In fact, she was still employed by Chevron in 1985 when she began volunteering for the American Chemical Society (ACS)'s Summer Experience for the Economically Disadvantaged (SEED) program in Northern California.

The SEED program offers summer jobs to economically disadvantaged high school students who have taken a course in chemistry and who are recommended by their chemistry teachers. These summer jobs are supervised by scientists in industry, academia, and government labs. The students must work full-time for nine weeks and are paid for their work.

Despite Elaine's enthusiasm for the program, she was initially frustrated by the local chapter's inability to attract qualified students from the relatively affluent Bay Area. Her inspiration was to expand SEED's Northern California territory. "Once we began recruiting students from California's Central Valley, the program really took off," Elaine said.

Suddenly she was interviewing many bright, economically disadvantaged students from the largely agricultural region. And she found that she was adept in establishing trust in the young applicants. "A lot of them had self-doubts, just as I'd had in college, where I took a wide range of courses before I found the right area for myself," Elaine said.

She continued, "Some of them were sure at first that they'd fail at any task. If I told them, 'You're going to be doing CPR on grapes,' some of them would say, 'Oh, I don't know if I can do that.'"

She developed a routine of picking up the applicants and driving them to the office where they were usually joined by other students. "I'd cover a wide range of subjects and ask them questions. There was always one student who couldn't answer a certain question. But then the other kids would chime in and help him get the answer."

A program that had been struggling to find students suddenly had 50 or more participants, working in a variety of labs that included academic and government institutions as well as Chevron.

Elaine sees her SEED job as "lighting the spark for these students and waiting to see which ones will take off." She adds, "Project SEED gives them the opportunity, but they have to do the work themselves. And if they have parental support, even if their parents don't speak English, that can make a big difference."

She is gratified by the number of former students who stay in touch after they move on from the SEED program. "Once they get their last check, they have no need to contact me" she said. "But many of them do."

She talks enthusiastically about the many “success stories” among former SEED students. For example, Frank and Christine are the children of a single mother who came to the U.S. from Hong Kong, after leaving her husband who was a gambling addict. She spoke no English but supported her children when they joined the SEED program. Frank went on to become a chemical engineer after graduating from the University of California at Berkeley, where he worked in the lab of a distinguished professor at Elaine’s recommendation. Christine went on to become a dentist.

Another of Elaine’s favorite recollections involves Rudy, a former DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) student who had to struggle with early doubts about himself. He told Elaine that if he didn’t get into SEED, he would have to pick grapes. “I told him, ‘That’s okay. I’ve done that.’ That’s how we connected. He joined the program for two years and eventually went on to get his PhD.”

Elaine’s work with SEED helped her win one of CRA’s 2019 Achievement Awards. And in 2020, she received an ACS award for encouraging disadvantaged students to pursue careers in science.

She reflects fondly on her own educational path. While at Brandeis, her advisor was a professor of organic chemistry. “He knew before I did that I could succeed in his field,” she recalls. “He gave me a chance to work in his lab and he talked to me about studying organic chemistry in graduate school.”

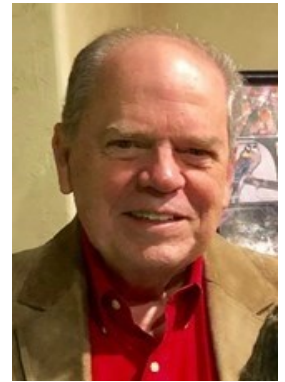
After her graduation from Yale, Elaine joined Chevron. “My career had three phases,” she recalls. “I started out making molecules – the only thing I knew how to do at that time. After that, I became a surface analytical chemist, which was a challenge because at the time there were no textbooks on how molecules reacted on surfaces. And finally, I worked in tribology. My first day in that job, I’d never heard of tribology and I thought it must be the study of tribes. But I soon learned that it had to do with friction, lubrication and wear.”

Elaine spent her entire career in Richmond, Calif., first with Chevron Research Co. and later with Oronite Additives, before retiring in 2010. At that time, she was already fully involved with SEED – and many more satisfying years awaited her.

## Face Masks



During the COVID-19 pandemic, face masks have been employed as a public and personal health control measure against the spread of SARS-CoV-2. Their use is intended as personal protection to prevent infection and as a source control to limit transmission of the virus in a community or healthcare setting.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that people wear masks in public settings around people who don't live in your household, especially when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain (i.e., staying six feet away from others). Masks help stop the spread of COVID-19 to others.

### Overview

- Wear masks with two or more layers to stop the spread of COVID-19
- Wear the mask over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- Masks should be worn by people two years old and older
- Masks should NOT be worn by children younger than two, people who have trouble breathing, or people who cannot remove the mask without assistance
- Do NOT wear masks intended for healthcare workers, such as, N95 respirators

## How Risky is Dining Out During the COVID-19 Pandemic?

There is some risk, but health officials say there are precautions you can take to minimize the chances you'll be exposed to the virus. According to the CDC,

1. Ordering takeout or delivery is still the safest option for getting restaurant food.
2. If you decide to eat at a restaurant, it's best to opt for outdoor seating, where tables are at least six feet apart. Dining inside a restaurant that hasn't reduced its capacity or safely distanced tables poses the most risk.

Diners should assess what other safety steps the restaurant is taking. For example, servers should be wearing masks, and the restaurant should have a process to ensure people are not congregating too closely while waiting for a table, says Dr. Susan Casey Bleasdale, at the University of Illinois at Chicago.

According to the CDC, digital or disposable menus and throwaway utensils are also preferable. Touchless payment options, like those available on your mobile device, are optimal. Otherwise, restaurants should have procedures for avoiding hand-to-hand contact with cash and credit cards.

If you are gathering at a restaurant with a group, Dr. Bleasdale suggests only dining with people you know, and checking if they have been feeling sick or experiencing any symptoms. She says that people more vulnerable to severe illness from the virus, such as the elderly, might want to avoid eating out at restaurants totally.

## Guard Your Medicare Number

According to Medicare, scammers may use the COVID-19 pandemic as an opportunity to steal your identity and commit Medicare fraud.

In some cases, they might tell you they'll send a Coronavirus test, masks, or other items in exchange for your Medicare number or personal information. Don't fall for it; it's a scam.

It's important to always guard your Medicare number and check your Medicare Summary Notice (MSN) for errors. Only give your Medicare number to participating Medicare pharmacists, primary and specialty care doctors, or people you trust to work with Medicare on your behalf. Remember, Medicare will never call you to verify your Medicare number.
