Speaker: Jim Bonwell

Jim Bonwell is the current CRA Benefits Committee Chair, having assumed that role in July 2023. Jim will talk about CRA Benefits, how he can help with questions about Chevron Benefits, Benefit Hub, and the new CRA Website. He retired in 2020 after 27 years with Chevron and joined the CRA Benefits Committee in 2021. During his time with Chevron, Jim spent his entire career in the field of Information Technology, starting at the Concord Data Center and finishing with Chevron Shipping at Chevron Park in San Ramon. Jim was the President of the Chevron Recreation Association in San Ramon for over 10 years and built the first website to promote discounts to employees. He helped create the first paid employee position of ChevRec Administrator. Eventually, the website was replaced with the current ChevRec BenefitHub we use today. After retiring, Jim continues to support the BenefitHub tool by providing access to retirees and working with Chevron to prompt corporate benefit partners. Jim is also a member of the CRA Communication Team that manages and supports the newly designed CRA website.

Chevron Property Redevelopment

Status:

Chevron has fully vacated its former headquarters at Bishop Ranch in San Ramon after relocating its corporate base to Texas. The large suburban office campus is no longer anchored by a major corporate tenant.

Plans:

The site's owner, Sunset Development, plans to redevelop the former Chevron campus and surrounding Bishop Ranch area into a dense, mixed-use district. The long-term vision includes thousands of new homes (potentially 8,000+ units), along with retail, restaurants, entertainment, and public spaces, transforming the area from an office park into a walkable, residential "urban-style" community over the next couple of decades.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2026-2027

DEADLINE MAY 15, 2026

This scholarship program is for children, grandchildren, or great-grandchildren of paid CRA Contra Costa Chapter members. The selection criteria are based on academics, achievements, personal insights, and future goals. We have a team of judges made up of two Chapter board members, a CRA national representative, an HR retiree, and an educator. Based on prior year giving and the donation from the Graduates Committee, we anticipate awarding **five scholarships for \$2000 each** for this academic year. The scholarship application will be available on the chapter website in late February.

We suggest that you encourage your children, grandchildren, or great-grandchildren to apply for one of the scholarships. Applicants that meet the requirements below should apply by submitting their applications by email (preferred) by **May 15, 2026**.

Students may apply each year they are eligible, but those who have previously been awarded one of our scholarships are not eligible to reapply. The criteria for eligibility are:

- Be a child, grandchild or great grandchild of a dues paying member of the chapter.
- Be age 25 and under.
- Be enrolled, or plan to be enrolled, in the coming school year in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two or four-year college or university.

We always appreciate your scholarship donations that you can make through Zelle, PayPal, or by check payable to Chevron Retirees Association, P.O. Box 371, Orinda, CA 94563. Since we started the program in 2005, we have awarded over \$148,000 to scholarship recipients. We are so proud of all our scholarship recipients, and we are pleased that our members have supported our program. The individuals we support may be future Chevron leaders!

Chevron Golf Club San Ramon (CGCSR) is an NCGA Affiliate Club that has as its base Chevron employees, contractors, and retirees. The club has about 60 members with indexes ranging from 1 to 34. We plan to run 24+ outings this year, where the club officers arrange for tee times. At these outings, we have an optional small game going (net or skins), closest to the pin prizes on 2 holes, a season-long match play, a club championship (net and gross winners) and a special end-of-year tournament. Most outings are on Friday or Saturday. We play a wide variety of courses, mostly East Bay, North Bay and Tri-Valley, as well as a few in Sacramento, plus a long weekend in Monterey. The NCGA affiliation means that you get an official NCGA handicap and have the opportunity to represent CGCSR in NCGA tournaments (partially subsidized by the club). CRA CONTRA COSTA (COCO) CHAPTER SURVEYS NEXT STEPS

Last year we obtained retiree feedback on how well we are accomplishing our mission through social interaction, education, communication and advocacy of mutually important issues.

Recently the Board reviewed the survey results to identify trends and agree on next steps. We want to thank everyone that participated. You helped us identify what is going well and offered improvement ideas.

We had good response rates for the surveys. The written comments were particularly helpful with suggestions. The three surveys included:

1. Chapter survey to our mailing list for Chevron retirees in August with 258 individuals completing the survey, 95% were already Chapter members. Which meant 37% of our current Chapter members responded to the survey and provided over 180 additional comments.
2. September Chapter Luncheon survey with 35 out of the 41 attendees completing the survey, 85% response rate with 31 additional comments.
3. Graduate Luncheon survey in December with 80 out of the 135 attendees completing the survey, 59% response rate with 24 additional comments.

Based on the results, our written communications are well-received with 98% of respondents reading one or more of our quarterly newsletters, 64% using the CRA website and 51% logging into the COCO Chapter website over the past 12 months. The topics found most interesting included:

- Updates from other members
- Upcoming meetings/activities
- Chapter, CRA and Chevron news
- Chevron benefits information
- In Memoriam

The Board will continue to dedicate resources to keeping our members up-to-date on the information they want to see. For this year, that includes a refresh of our chapter website that will be more user friendly.

Luncheons are currently our primary venue for social interaction, so we spent quite a bit of time reviewing the luncheon feedback from all three surveys. For individuals attending the luncheons the average score to the statement, I'm glad I attended today's luncheon, was 4.8 (5 being Strongly agree). However, for respondents that hadn't attended a luncheon the top reasons included:

- Timing didn't fit my schedule, 44%
- Don't really know any of the other attendees, 24%
- Don't enjoy attending luncheons, 17%
- Cost to attend was too high, 13%

We also heard several alternatives to luncheons that will be tried in 2026 – additional activities such as a trip to an event (e.g. game, play, museum, etc.), chapter volunteer opportunities, Zoom presentations from Chevron management and a happy hour get together for individuals that can't make or prefer an alternative other than a luncheon. We hope the new activities will attract new members, improve attendance and better meet our members' wants. We are also exploring ways to help new individuals feel more included at events.

Finally, there were a couple of comments about rotating Board membership. This year we will look at our Board governance, particularly the process for adding new Board members and soliciting volunteers, more to follow. If you are currently interested in volunteering send an email to president@chevronretireescontracosta.org.

Your feedback is making a difference. The Board serves our members and is dedicated to the promotion of the interest of retirees, spouses and surviving spouses. For 2026, we will continue to gather luncheon and event feedback to help us determine if our proposed changes are making a difference.


DIRECTIONS TO CHEVRON LAKESIDE 5001 EXECUTIVE PARKWAY, SAN RAMON
