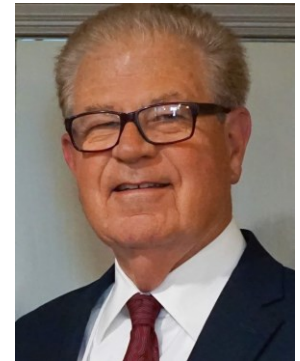

President's Letter

Hello again, it's time for my brief update on CRA developments.

National Meetings

Every year the CRA leadership team meets twice. The first one is the Mid-Year Meeting (MYM) that normally takes place in late January near Chevron's headquarters in the Bay Area. This meeting is for the purpose of discussing current and future business plans for the CRA on a nation-wide basis. The CRA national officers attend, as well as the Committee Chairpersons. In order to keep in touch with our chapters, all of the Area Vice Presidents also attend the MYM. They provide the attendees with an update about what is going on with the chapters in their Area.



At the MYM, the upcoming Annual Meeting (AM) is discussed and an agenda for that meeting is developed. We also discuss and plan for future AMs. At the present time we have plans for the 2020 AM in Denver, the 2021 AM in Southern California, the 2022 AM in the Pacific Northwest, and the 2023 AM in the Baltimore area. Each of those AMs is in a different stage of planning and they are sponsored by individual Areas. The Denver AM is being sponsored by the Intermountain Area, a prospective cruise by the Southern California Area, the northwest meeting by the Northwest Area, and Baltimore by the North Atlantic Area. The national leadership team provides advice and encouragement to each of the Area sponsors, as well as monitoring the budgets for the AMs. Attendance at the AMs include not only the national leadership team, but all Presidents of Chapters throughout the US and Canada. We also invite Chevron Corporation management to the AMs. This normally includes personnel from human resources and public relations. We have been honored several times in the past to have Chevron's CEO also attend and give us a keynote address at our banquet dinner. It's great sign that Chevron Corporation places such personal attention to the CRA.

Communications

One of the goals I announced previously was to study ways the CRA could utilize "social media" to better communicate with our members. I feel this is particularly important looking forward. Future retirees will be accustomed to using social media on a daily basis. The CRA needs to evolve and adapt to a changing world. I was initially looking at Facebook as first step into the social media world. However, to my surprise and delight, Chevron Corporation has come up with a potentially better solution. Chevron has established "Chevron Connect" (A Facebook Group) in the past year. The purpose is to provide employees with an easy and instant way to broadcast information, ideas, and better ways of doing jobs. Although voluntary, about 80% of Chevron employees are participating in this new program. And even better, Chevron will allow CRA members to participate in a version of this program, especially designed for the CRA. Details are under development and we will keep you informed.

Membership

As with the Chevron Connect project, I am always open to exploring better ways of promoting CRA membership. Recently, the President of our East Bay Chapter, Steve Bergtholdt, came up with an idea to create more camaraderie among his chapter members. He designed and found a vendor that would produce custom polo shirts with the Chevron logo and CRA on them. The shirts would be made available to his chapter members. Steve asked me if making these shirts with the Chevron logo and CRA was OK with the CRA and Chevron Corporation. I made an inquiry with Chevron and was advised to proceed – especially since the proposed vendor was “The Chevron Store.” Steve is working with them and ordering shirts for his chapter. All of our chapter Presidents should consider whether CRA-logo shirts or other apparel would be useful for their chapter. These items could be customized to include your own chapter name. If you have an interest in this, you can contact me and/or The Chevron Store at www.chevronstore.com. Using Chevron logo items is not new; small logo items have been passed out at several AMs. At the 2013 AM, we provided CRA cruise caps to all attendees, as well as dozens of sweatshirts. They were a big hit with the attendees.

I hope to see you in the future, hopefully at an AM. Have a great fall and holiday season.

Chevron News Briefs

Chevron Sets New Greenhouse Gas Reduction Goals

Chevron Plans to Reduce Emission Intensity from Oil and Natural Gas Production

Oct. 3, 2019 - Chevron Corporation has established new goals to reduce net greenhouse gas (GHG) emission intensity from upstream oil and natural gas. Emission intensity is the emission rate of greenhouse gas per unit of energy produced. The company intends to lower upstream oil net GHG emission intensity by 5 - 10 percent and upstream natural gas net GHG emission intensity by 2 - 5 percent from 2016 to 2023. The timing is aligned with stock take milestones set in the Paris Agreement on climate change.

The GHG emission intensity reduction metrics apply to all upstream Chevron oil and natural gas, whether Chevron has operational control or not.

“Global demand for energy continues to grow, and we are committed to delivering more energy with less environmental impact,” said Michael Wirth, Chevron's Chairman and CEO.

Chevron Donates \$500,000 to Help Teachers in the Greater Houston Area to Restore Classroom Learning After Severe Flooding

Oct. 1, 2019 - In the aftermath of Tropical Storm Imelda, Chevron U.S.A. Inc. announced it will donate \$500,000 to help support local public schools in select cities and neighborhoods of the Greater Houston area. The donation will be applied to help fund eligible classroom projects posted on DonorsChoose.org through Chevron's Fuel Your School program.

During this time of need, Chevron has made changes to the program to better serve this affected area. To assist in the region's recovery, Chevron will not base the program's funding in select cities and neighborhoods of the Greater Houston area on fuel sales. Instead, Chevron will donate the full \$500,000 for the program in this area toward eligible projects posted on DonorsChoose.org. Fuel Your School project eligibility requirements will still apply.

"With so many Greater Houston area communities impacted by this tragedy – many of which are still recovering from the devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey in 2017 – it's important for us to support recovery efforts," said Damon Echevarria, Chevron's vice president of Americas Products, East and Latin America. "We're proud to support local teachers and students and are committed to helping them rebuild their classrooms by helping to provide the resources needed to restore learning."

Chevron to Boost Production at St. Malo Field in the Gulf of Mexico

Sep. 19, 2019 - Chevron Corporation today announced the sanction of a waterflood project in the St. Malo field. This application of enabling technology is expected to increase recovery and advance Chevron's strategy of maximizing the company's existing resources in the Gulf of Mexico.

"The St. Malo field is a world-class asset that is positioned for highly economic brownfield development," said Steve Green, President of Chevron North America Exploration and Production. "With our leading technology, experienced workforce and broad portfolio, we're delivering value in the Gulf of Mexico."

The waterflood project is Chevron's first in the deepwater Wilcox trend and is expected to contribute an estimated ultimate recovery of more than 175 million barrels of oil equivalent. It will include two new production wells, three new injector wells and topsides injection equipment for the Jack/St. Malo floating production unit, allowing us to extend the life of the field.

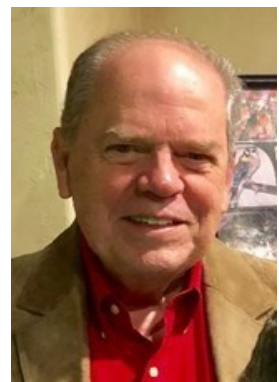

Open Enrollment for Plan Year 2020

In recent weeks Via Benefits has been sending to both Chevron HRA-qualified and non HRA-qualified participants the Fall 2019 Medicare Edition of its newsletter, The Via Benefits Advocate. This newsletter provides



important information about Medicare's Open Enrollment Period for Chevron's post-65 retirees and post-65 dependents and survivors. This Open Enrollment period runs from **October 15 thru December 7, 2019**. The information included in this newsletter provides how to use the services of Via Benefits to evaluate your current plan and if you choose, enroll in a new plan.

As stated in the newsletter, "Medicare Supplement Insurance (Medigap) Plan F and Plan C are going away in 2020 for new enrollees, but NOT for people already enrolled in the plans. Those already enrolled in Plan F or Plan C will be "grandfathered" in and able to continue with their plans as long as they want."

The newsletter also includes an update regarding the coverage gap, also known as the "donut hole", which will take effect in 2020 for Part D Prescription Drug plans.

If you are either a Chevron HRA-qualified or non-qualified participant and have not yet received your copy of this newsletter by either email or postal mail, please contact Via Benefits: In US: 1-844-266-1392; Outside US: 801-994-9805. Hours of Operation: Monday to Friday, 7 am - 8 pm, Central time. Copies are also shown on the Via Benefits website (<https://www.my.viabenefits.com/chevron>) and available for downloading.

Note: Please be aware that the Open Enrollment Period for Chevron's pre-65 retirees and pre-65 dependents and survivors will run from **October 14 thru October 25, 2019**. Chevron will be sending out information on that Open Enrollment Period to eligible participants.

A REMINDER

The next time you refresh your profile on the Via Benefits website, be sure to confirm or add your new Medicare number, which is on the front of your Medicare card right below your name. The new Medicare cards have this new Medicare number (which replaces your Social Security Number) to provide additional security.

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) completed reissuing cards with this new number as of April, 2019, and new cards provided after April, 2018 include it as well. As of December 31, 2019, you must use this new Medicare number for enrollment and identification purposes.
